<b>Recent Weather:</b>		Sunny in the 80's. No rain for last couple weeks.					
<b>TRAIL LANDMARKS</b>		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Trailhead leaves Sawcut Notch Path at Marker 4042. Treadway is almost road width. Signage on Sawcut Notch notes Randolph Avenue heading northwest at 550 yards and Chickatawbut Overlook heading southeast at 0.5 miles.</li> <li>• 16" concrete culvert, L to R, under treadway at 183 feet heading to wetland area.</li> <li>• 30" clay culvert, R to L, under treadway at 350' draining from wetland area noted above.</li> <li>• Unnamed path leaving trail on right at 380'.</li> <li>• Trail continues right at .11 miles at Marker 4023. Unnamed trail leaves to the left off the reservation. Sign on tree notes CCC Memorial 50 yards. Trail narrows to footpath width.</li> <li>• At .17 miles on left, historical marker for CCC Camp. Wording as follows: <div style="text-align: center; margin: 10px 0;"> <p>Civilian Conservation Corps Blue Hills Camp 1933 – 1937</p> </div> <p>Near this site in 1933 was erected one of 28 Civilian Conservation Corps camps built in Massachusetts. These camps housed over one hundred thousand young men who were given needed employment. They built roads, bridges and trails, planted twelve million trees, fought forest fires and controlled insects and plant diseases in forests and woodlands of the commonwealth.</p> </li> <li>• At .18 miles on right, historical stone marker for CCC Camp. Wording as follows: <div style="text-align: center; margin: 10px 0;"> <p>Site of Civilian Conservation Corps Camp SP #1 Company 1170 1933 100,000 Inrolles 1937 One of 28 Camps in Mass</p> </div> </li> <li>• Cut and mortared stone wall on both sides of trail at stone memorial for about 80 feet.</li> <li>• 30" concrete culvert, R to L, under treadway at .24 miles.</li> <li>• Trail turns right at Marker 4010 at .32 miles and Nike Ajax Path starts to the left. Trail widens to road width.</li> <li>• Trail ends at Sawcut Notch Path at Marker 4014 at .41 miles.</li> </ul>
