I could not find a name for this path of the FOBH trail resources, it is the path on the West side of the southern-most of the two St. Moritz ponds. The path is very overgrown. Pete Tierney and I walked the path together to get an idea of what work needs to be done to open up this path (see work remaining).

At the northern terminus, where the path intersects with the skyline path I located some old wooden steps that appear to be the beginning of the trail. The path travells in a North-South direction across flat land, it then approaches the pond and follows the edge of the pond for a few hundred yards before it comes upon the remains of a firepit that was constructed for use during the winter carnivals of the 1930's.

The path then heads southwest climbing up to the top of a spur. You then follow this spur for a few hundred yards until it rejoins the 'un-named' path that runs parallel to Murphy Path.

The path is very overgrown and the entrances on both side obscure. Along the path there are multiple blow-downs.
