<b>TRAIL LANDMARKS</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Trailhead is located on the north side of Hillside Street approximately 3/8 of a mile west of the Hillside Street, Blue Hills River Road intersection.</li> <li>• Trailhead is fairly hidden from the street however opens to a footpath once into the woods. Trailhead should be marked. Located across the street 300 feet from the Brookwood Road.</li> <li>• Accord Path Marker 1062 crosses at 307 feet. There is a ditch that collects water from Brookwood Trail and moves it across Accord Path.</li> <li>• Series of stone waterbreaks heading up the hill starting at 350 feet.</li> <li>• Stone waterbar, R to L, at .1 miles. Clean and improve.</li> <li>• Stone waterbar, L to R at .18 miles. Clean.</li> <li>• Series of stone waterbreaks at .19 miles.</li> <li>• Rock walls on L and R at .20 miles.</li> <li>• Wooden waterbar, L to R, at .22 miles. Clean.</li> <li>• Brookwood Trail ends at intersection with the Wildcat Notch Path just south of the Marker 1083 at .41 miles. Swale collects water from Brookwood Trail and moves it across Wildcat Notch Path.</li> </ul>
