TRAIL LANDMARKS	 Trailhead leaves from the south side of Chickatawbut Road at a granite marker labeled Kitchamakin Hill. Trailhead is approximately 1/8 of a mile east of the Chickatawbut Overlook. For the purpose of this assessment, the trail was surveyed as I interpreted it referencing the old FBH and current DCR maps. Trail is noted on the DCR map however is unnamed. Treadway is blazed in areas going over rock slabs with faded yellow dots and orange rectangles however there is very little blazing of trees making route finding very difficult with many backtracks having to be made to locate the proper trail. Thanks to Bob Wolcott for assisting. Recommend that this trail be re-blazed before route finding becomes impossible as the growing season gets into full swing. (1) Treadway leaving the marker does not have a clearly defined footpath. There is a white square blaze on a tree 25 feet south of the granite marker that can be used as a guide to locate a lightly defined footpath a little further south. Bn at 40 feet. Sbd crosses the treadway at 60 feet. Can be stepped over. Remove. Overhead bn at 100 feet. Downed limbs in the treadway at 200 feet as treadway begins ascending. Downed limbs in the treadway at 260 feet. Treadway begins ascending over a rock slab at 325 feet. Overhead bn at 410 feet. Lbd crosses the treadway at 440 feet. Can be stepped over. Bn continues through .11 miles.

	 Treadway turns left leaving Nahanton Hill descending at .21 miles following yellow dots and orange rectangles on the slabs. Treadway enters the Skyline Trail at .22 miles. DCR map shows intersection marker 3103 at this location and it could not be found. (2) Treadway begins descending over a series of rock steps as the Great Dome Foot Path and the Skyline Trail share the same treadway. Treadway enters an intersection with the Sassaman Notch Path at
	 intersection marker 3103 at .24 miles. I believe this intersection marker is in its wrong location according to the DCR map. (3) The Great Dome Foot Path and the Skyline Trail cross Sassaman Notch
	Path and continue south.
	• The Great Dome Foot Path leaves the Skyline Trail on the left after passing a large boulder (glacial erratic) at .27 miles. Route finding is difficult as the treadway scrambles up the slabs however becomes better defined beyond the slabs.
	• Unnamed path leaves on the right at .31 mile to the Skyline Trail.
